




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
# The trialing process (January 24 - March 14, 2023)














## **Background information**

Most of the participants (n=144, 78,69%) are female, 36 participants (19,7%) are male, and 3 participants (1,6%) identify themselves as "non-binary/other."








# Country of residence/work/study

- 50 Spanish (32%)
- 35 Turkish (19,13%)
- **25** Polish (13,66%)
- 19 Slovenian (10,38%)
- 15 Croatian (8,20%)
- 14 French (7,65%)
- 13 pilotees from other nationalities (7,13%)
- 8 German (4,37%)
- 4 Italian (2,19%) pilotees.








#### Participants' experience in LSP

- 98 pilotees (n=98, 53,55%) had up to five years of experience in LSP.
- 29 pilotees (15,85%) had 5-10 years of experience,
- 17 pilotees (9,29%) had 10-15 years of experience,
- 20 pilotees (10,93%) had 15-20 years of experience,
- 19 pilotees (10,38%) had more than 20 years of experience in LSP.







#### **Completed modules**

Participants were asked to complete at least four modules.


Overall, **556** successful approaches to the module were recorded.

- 40 participants completed four modules.
- 22 participants completed five modules.
- 28 participants completed just one.





#### Pilotees' self-assessment of knowledge and skills before & after taking each module







#### **Gained Knowledge**

The data regarding the knowledge gain in the course was analyzed by conducting the paired samples t-test. The results showed that there was a statistically significant difference between the pre-test and post-test scores of all modules.

The most significant knowledge gain was calculated in **Module 3**, and the mean difference between the pre-test scores and the post-test scores in this module was 1,30.







#### Responses to the Pre- and Post-tests

The highest number of responses in the Preparticipation test was for Module 0 (n=155, 22,4%).

**Module 1** received the second highest number of responses (n=115, 16,6%).

The third highest number of responses (n=106, 15,3%) was for **Module 2.** 

The highest number of responses in the **Post-participation test** was for **Module 0** (n=127, 22,8%). The second highest number of responses (n=86, 15,5%) in the post-participation test was **for Module 1.** The third highest number of responses (n=85, 15,3%) was for **Module 2.** 







#### **Favourite Modules**

Module 0: The most preferred module (n=90).

Module 1: The second most preferred module (n=80).

Module 2:The third most preferred module (n=76).





#### The pilotees' benefitted from the course...

- I understand the needs analysis, which is extremely important for an LSP course.
- I plan to do a more elaborate needs analysis in the future.
- I am writing my thesis on ESL now and information about data collection tools and data analysis will be so helpful for me.
- I will **refine the syllabus and improve** my teaching materials.
- How to design the LSP course considering all the characteristics.
- I am going to **conduct a needs analysis** for a Nursing course that I've just started teaching for the first time.
- I learned **practical examples** of models of activities; needs analysis before the course.
- I am doing a Business English course at the moment, and I can certainly **put these theories into practice/integrate** with the course syllabus I had already prepared.





- I'd like to have further **practice with corpora in ESP**.
- I will **use** corpora.
- I learned methods of **searching for language corpora**; **developing, writing and speaking** skills of the students.
- I intend to **widen my testing instruments** to make them more varied and also to explore the use of corpora for my materials and classes.
- I have learned the difference between task, problem and project based approaches. I have also learned what a driving question is.
- The lesson plan analysis was also a useful exercise.
- This module has helped me to widen my knowledge on **TBL, PBL and PBL,** which will clearly allow me to improve my teaching.
- I discovered new assessment activities.





#### Future use of the course

Pilotees were also asked to state if they acquired the knowledge that they intended to put into practice after the course.

The majority of the participants (n=82, 89,1%) reported having acquired the knowledge that they intend to put into practice after the course.

I **learned** so many things about LSP and in the future I am planning to teach those things to my students as well.







#### Quizzes

The LSP-TEOC.Pro course consisted of **71 quizzes.** 

Participants were asked different types of questions throughout the course.





# Types of questions

- The LSP-TEOC.Pro course consisted of
   314 questions in eight modules.
- There were six different types of questions in the course. True/False questions were the highest in number (n=111). Short answer questions were the lowest in number (n=12).










#### Distribution of questions

- Module 1 included the highest number of questions (n=60; 19, 10%).
- **Module 4** (n=49; 15,60%).
- **Module 3.2** (n=43; 13,9%)
- Module 5 (n=43; 13,9%)
- Module 6 (n=38; 12,10%,
- Module 7 (n=27, 8,59%), Module 0 (n=24; 7,64%), Module 2 (n=24; 7,64%), Module 3.1 (n=6; 1,91).
